A walking or cycling route
Total distance - 3 miles

1 Railway Station

Start at March Railway Station entrance on Station Road. Pass through the Car Park (Station Approach) taking care at the far end where the footpath ends. Should you require a comfort break at this stage of your journey toilet facilities can be located in the main station building during opening hours. To continue the route, head along the National Cycle Network path, Route 63.
Distance 330 yards

which provides a route all the way from Peterborough through to Wisbech.
Distance 1000 yards or 0.6 miles

4 Whitemoor Nature Reserve

Part way along Longhill Road you will come to the entrance to Whitemoor Nature Reserve on the left hand side. At the reserve you will find picturesque areas of water and wonderful tree lined walks to explore.
Distance 440 yards or 0.25 miles

2 Play Park

Follow the shared use path through the park, past the play area to exit onto Robin-goodfellows Lane. Continue straight ahead to the junction with Norwood Road. Turn right here towards the level crossing and follow the road to the roundabout. Seating can be found in the park and at the junction with Norwood Road.
Distance 1200 yards or 0.68 miles

5 Circular Route

To complete the circular route, continue along Longhill Road to Elm Road and turn right. Here the traffic speed limit increases to 60mph and the road can be busy.

Follow Elm Road towards the town centre taking particular care at the disused railway crossing where there is a section of missing footpath.

3 Hundred Road

Take the second exit (straight across) the roundabout to continue along the northern section of Hundred Road where the road becomes a rural track. Please take care crossing the roundabout and of vehicles entering and leaving the Recycling Centre. Follow the lane for some way past the Recycling Centre until you come to a right-hand pathway linking to Longhill Road. Along this section you will see the blue National Cycle Network (NCN63) signs

Head along this road for some distance to the double roundabout. Take the second and first exits (straight across) to reach Station Road. Follow Station Road until you reach March Railway Station.
Distance 1.25 miles

Alternative Route

For a quieter return route to March Railway Station, avoiding Elm Road, retrace your steps back through Hundred Road, Norwood Road and Robingoodfellow Lane.
Distance 1.6 miles

Points to note:

- Please take care along Norwood Road and Elm Road as these can be busy.
- Footpaths and drop kerbs are available along most of the route (exceptions are located on the northern section of Hundred Road and the disused level crossing on Elm Road).
- The route is flat, step-free and road based.
- Dogs are permitted in Whitemoor Nature Reserve.
